



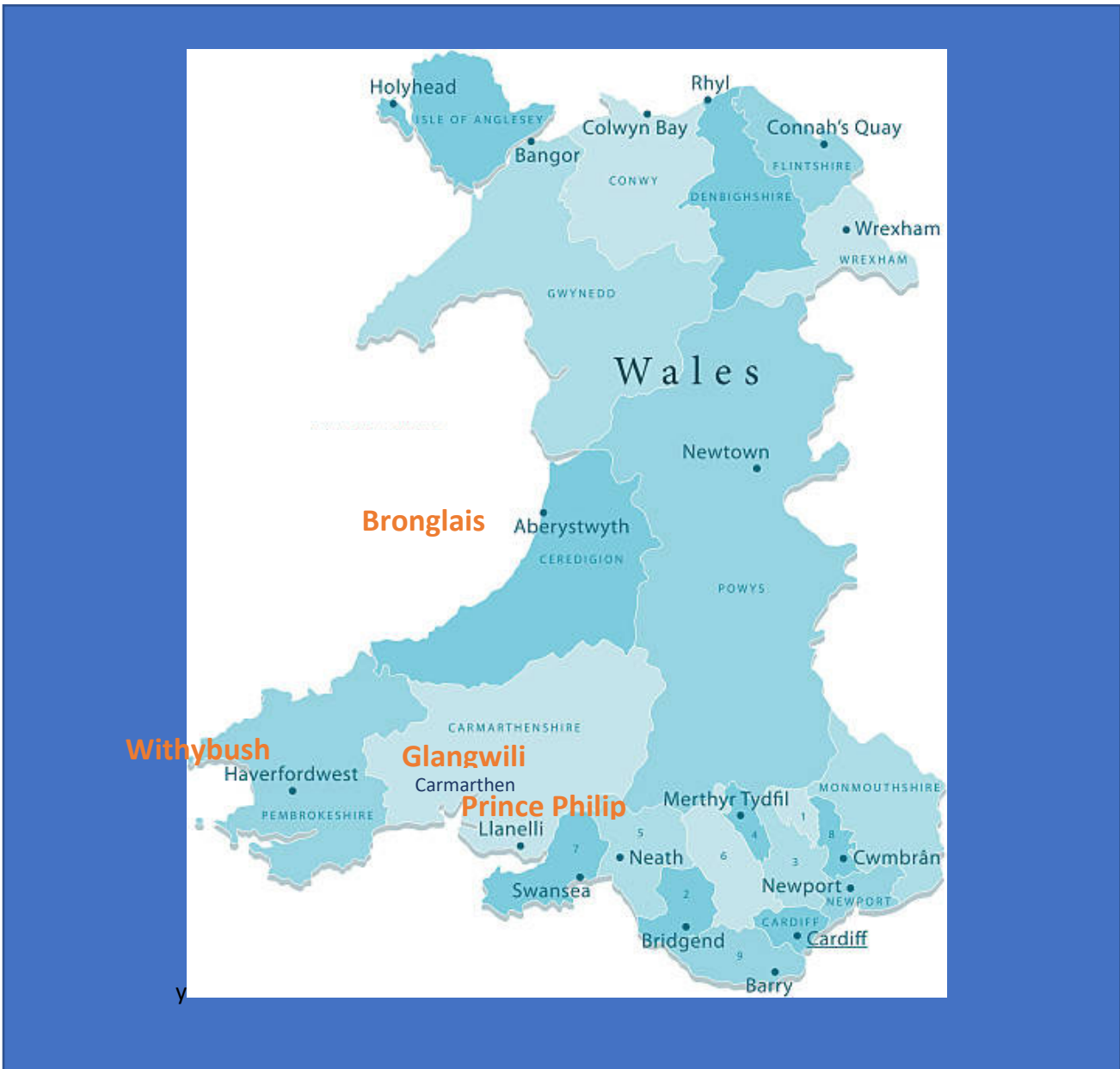

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## Prince Philip Hospital



Prince Philip Hospital is located on the outskirts of Llanelli, in easy reach of the M4 motorway and coastal relief road. The hospital is on bus routes, including a link from the railway station.

Benefiting for a new 'front of house' investment, the

hospital has an Acute Medical Assessment Unit and Minor Injuries Unit. The hospital provides comprehensive General Medicine services, Elective General Surgery, Urology and Orthopaedic services.

Trainees and Medical Students have access to a fully functioning Clinical Skills Lab. There is also a programme of simulated patient scenarios.

Prince Philip Hospital / Llanelli area has achieved excellence in:-

- The Wellness and Life Science Village at Delta Lakes, Llanelli, is part of ARCH (A Regional Collaboration for Health) in partnership with Swansea Bay University Health Board. The initiative covers the whole of South West Wales and will benefit a million people.
- A Rapid Access Lung Cancer clinic
- State of the art Breast Unit

All trainees are encouraged to participate in the Quality and Safety Agenda by undertaking Clinical Audits and Quality Improvement Projects.

## Hospital Provided Accommodation

All Foundation Doctors in Wales are offered free hospital accommodation for the duration of their Foundation Year 1.

In the unlikely event that there is no accommodation available, there is a possibility of you being able to claim expenses.

Below we have briefly outlined the accommodation that is available within this Health Board:-

- The accommodation for Foundation doctors is sited in the designated residential blocks which are in close proximity to the hospital and Medical Education Centre.
- Single rooms are provided, but there are some flats for married accommodation which may be available to rent, subject to availability.
- Each block has flats with four bedrooms sharing a kitchen and bathroom. Some rooms have en-suite wc and showers.
- There is a carpark for residents' use on the hospital site.
- The Doctors Mess has Sky TV, Wifi and a kitchen area. There is a monthly charge to cover the facilities.

<p>This post offers the opportunity to be part of a friendly and dynamic team of gastroenterology consultants, Dieticians and specialist nurses. The trainee will have the opportunity to have exposure to, and be involved in the active management of a wide range of luminal and hepatology related conditions that are seen as an in-patient in Prince Philip Hospital including complex inflammatory bowel disease, Decompensated liver disease, Gastrointestinal malignancies and advanced nutritional related pathologies. The trainee will benefit from regular consultant ward rounds and bed side teaching that will build knowledge and clinical reasoning. All members of the team are encouraged to seek out educational opportunities in particular attending outpatients to both observe and see patients themselves. Specialist clinics run regularly in PPH including complex IBD, Liver disease comprising of viral hepatitis and post liver transplant follow up alongside general gastroenterology referrals. There will also be an opportunity to attend the endoscopy department to observe both Upper and lower Gastrointestinal endoscopy which will include therapeutics, and all trainees are expected to complete the attachment being competent in performing abdominal paracentesis. Alongside their usual ward duties the junior doctor will also be part of the general medical rota and have the opportunity to see acutely unwell medical patients being admitted to the acute medical assessment unit while being a part of the Medical emergency Team (MET) and attending acute stroke thrombolysis calls.</p>

<p>This post will introduce the doctor to the full range of rheumatological disorders through attending 4 outpatient clinics per week, the rheumatology day unit and seeing ward referrals with one of the 3 rheumatology consultants. There will be the opportunity to develop specialty specific procedural skills such as therapeutic intramuscular, intra-articular injections, and soft tissue injections depending on the preference of the doctor. Blood results from clinics will be the responsibility of the doctor to check daily and any unexpected abnormal results can be discussed with the clinician who last saw the patient in clinic. There will be time to become familiar with drug counselling and monitoring, pre-screening investigations for DMARDs and biologic therapies and to develop knowledge about chronic disease management. IT skills can be developed through the use of our electronic patient record and communication skills, by the doctor seeing patients in clinic and then presenting their findings to the consultant who will then see the patient with the doctor. There will be time during the week for a quality improvement activity, or case study to be done. There is an on call medical rota commitment and engagement with weekly junior doctor teaching, journal club and grand rounds will be encouraged.</p>

<p>The FY1 will be working in the breast unit in Prince Philip Hospital. This will comprise of patients being admitted for elective breast surgery. Most of the procedures will be for diagnosed Breast Cancer patients with a minority being related to Cosmesis. The Junior Doctor will be expected to be in the ward by 8am and be part of the Ward Round. They will be involved in pre-assessing patients prior to the surgical procedure. They will also be expected to attend theatre to assist in the basic resectional breast surgical operations, and to attend clinics in which new patients with a breast problem are assessed. They will present in at least 2 journal clubs on a Tuesday morning and complete one audit. There will be no on-call commitments related to breast surgery. The usual working day ends at 4:30pm.</p>

<p>The team is led by two consultants and consists of two Specialty doctors, 1 x IMT, 1 x Clinical Fellow an FY2 and FY1 trainee.</p> <p>Juniors are expected to attend 4 consultant-led ward rounds per week and one middle grade led ward round. The patient mix is predominantly cardiology and general internal medicine.</p> <p>Our foundation doctors together with the team, will look after a total of 24 patients on the general cardiology ward but also be involved in the care of 4 patients on CCU. Foundation doctors currently attend a daily ward round in the new ACS treat and repatriate bay catering for acute cardiac patients across the Health board awaiting invasive management at the Morryston Cardiac Centre. This is a very valuable teaching opportunity within the setting of urgent cardiology.</p> <p>Plans for a full-time ANP to support the foundation/ junior doctors are in place and imminent.</p> <p>Foundation doctors will be carrying out daily tasks such as core bedside procedures, completing electronic medication take homes and discharge summaries. We have at least two teaching rounds per week where foundation doctors are encouraged to present and discuss cases.</p> <p>The on-call commitment is 1:20 with prospective cover, the foundation doctors will have a mix of on-call responsibilities between clerking patients through the acute medical admissions unit for a largely unselected medical take to providing general ward cover. The foundation doctors are always supervised by a middle grade and consultant during on-call. Trainees are encouraged to attend cardiology clinics, non-invasive and invasive cardiac investigation lists for their own interest and education.</p> <p>At least two of our ward rounds per week are teaching ward rounds as described. Juniors will present cases themselves and a discussion will follow regarding the diagnosis and management. We have weekly cardiology team meetings where juniors will choose and present topics for discussion.</p>

Also will be rotating through main theatres to be exposed to Anaesthetic Management of elective patients of various specialties in Orthopaedics, General Surgery and Breast Surgery. The candidate will be exposed to learning the airway management, induction and emergence of anaesthesia and will also be exposed to different types of pain management in recovery.

The Palliative Care service includes a Consultant, Associate Specialist, Registrar and FY2 and has a 7 bedded hospice on site. The team also do regular ward rounds providing advice on medical inpatients. There are excellent learning opportunities to gain the competencies necessary for the FY1 year. Procedures that can be learnt, other than the core competencies, include Bone Marrow biopsies, PICC and Hickman line removals. There is also the opportunity to gain exposure to laboratory services including blood film and bone marrow reporting.
